This program is designed to serve **Bigstone Cree Nation youth**, offering hands-on hunting education, outdoor skills training, and faith-based mentorship in a structured and well-supervised setting. Through ethical hunting practices, conservation teachings, and positive adult guidance, youth will gain practical knowledge while learning responsibility, respect for wildlife, and care for the land.

Wild Faith Hunting Adventures creates space for youth to discover a **positive sense of purpose**, strengthen their identity, and grow in confidence. Participants will be equipped with leadership skills, decision-making abilities, and a spiritual foundation that supports healthy life choices. The camp emphasizes discipline, patience, teamwork, and accountability—qualities that extend beyond the outdoor setting and into everyday life.

The program also provides meaningful opportunities for **Bigstone Cree Nation communities** to invest in future generations. Elders, hunters, mentors, and leaders are invited to share knowledge, experience, and guidance, fostering intergenerational connection and community unity. By bringing members of all ages together on the land, the camp strengthens cultural continuity and shared responsibility.

Wild Faith Hunting Adventures promotes **positive youth engagement**, encourages ethical and lawful hunting practices, increases outdoor participation, and supports strong character development rooted in faith, responsibility, and respect. Through this program, youth are not only taught how to hunt, but how to lead, serve, and walk with purpose—on the land and in life.

Wild Faith Hunting Adventures youth camp is designed as a faith-centered youth hunting camp that will build skills, character, a sense of community through safe, supervised outdoor activities and real-life experiences. A camp where youth can find a positive purpose. Bigstone Cree Nation youth will gain hunting knowledge, outdoor skills training, and faith-based mentorship in a safe, well supervised outdoor environment. Our youth will be equipped with a new confidence; responsibility, and respect for wildlife and conservation while building a spiritual foundation and leadership skills. Bigstone Cree Nation communities will gain a meaningful way to invest in our future generations, sharing expertise, and allowing our members of all ages to come together. Wild Faith Hunting Adventures youth camp will create positive youth engagement, promote ethical hunting practice, encourage outdoor participation, and build strong character development rooted in faith and responsibility.

Note: All hunters/volunteers will provide a copy of ATV insurance, Possession and Acquisition License (PAL), First Aid Certification, and all other necessary documentation. All hunting gear and necessary equipment such as hatchet, sawsall, rope, flashlight, spotlight, rain gear, rifle, ammunition, camo gear, binoculars, game bags, moose caller, orange vest, rubber boots, etc.

Wild Faith Hunting Adventures aims to address cultural, spiritual, and developmental needs amongst Bigstone Cree Nation youth by reconnecting youth with traditional land-based knowledge, safe hunting practices, and healthy lifestyle skills. The camp goals are to strengthen cultural continuity by teaching youth how to harvest moose, rabbits, and prairie chickens, preserving skills that are declining as fewer young people learn traditional harvesting methods. It supports community well-being by passing down survival skills and land-based knowledge that Elders relied on, addressing the growing gap between past, present, and future generations. Foundational firearm safety training reduces risks associated with inexperienced youth handling weapons, a documented concern in many rural and Indigenous communities. The hunting camp promotes respect for wildlife, responsible harvesting, helping counter trends of declining stewardship and environmental disconnect among our youth. Faith-based mentorship provides spiritual grounding and positive role models, offering protective factors shown to reduce youth disengagement and risky behaviours. Outdoor activity and time on the land encourage physical health, mental wellness, and resilience; areas where Indigenous youth often face higher barriers and health disparities. By creating meaningful memories and strengthening identity, the camp supports long-term community cohesion and pride in Cree traditions and values.

Target Timelines and outcomes for each Quarter (provide a brief summary):

July-September

From July - September 2026, over a 3 month period our main objective is to plan and organize all details to host the "Wild Faith Hunting Adventures" camp. The main objective is to create a detailed plan that outlines dates, age, schedules, duration, lodging and facilities, and transportation. Other focus areas of safety, legal, and ethical requirements, staffing, volunteers, gear, registration, and communications.

October-December

From October - December 2026, the team will begin the process to provide a detailed report to the Bigstone Cree Nation - Trust by December 31st, 2026. Gather feedback, information pertaining to the youth camp, and gather all necessary documents to ensure financial accountability.

Wild Faith Hunting Adventures requires access to safe hunting land, lodging, and outdoor spaces for instruction and devotionals.

The camp must also secure bathrooms, showers, clean water, and reliable transportation for moving youth and staff. Safety resources are essential, including permits, waivers, insurance, medical information, and trained first aid personnel. All staff and volunteers need background checks, clear roles, and training in both youth supervision and outdoor safety. The program depends on experienced hunting mentors, faith leaders, cooks, logistics helpers, and range qualified instructors. Equipment needs include firearms or bows, ammunition, protective gear and equipment, radios, tents or cabins, sleeping gear, and teaching materials. The curriculum requires structured lessons in firearm safety, wildlife identification, tracking, navigation, and conservation ethics. Faith based programming adds devotionals, worship sessions, and small group discussions to support spiritual growth. Food supplies, meal planning, communication tools, and weather ready logistics complete the operational resources needed to run the camp successfully.

Investments in safety, insurance, and transportation are critical due to the remote outdoor setting.
